Dear American Prep Families,

February Builder Theme: I am a builder when I befriend others.

The word *befriend* is an old world that literally means *be a friend to by offering help or support*. There are some specific skills needed to truly befriend others such as empathy, respect, and tolerance. Yet one of the most important traits is plain old-fashioned kindness.

Make caring for others a priority

Too often, parents prioritize their children's happiness and achievements over their children's concern for others. But children need to learn to balance their needs with the needs of others, whether it's passing the ball or deciding to stand up for friend who is being bullied. Help your child honor commitments, even if it is uncomfortable. Before she quits a sports team, band, or a friendship, help her to consider her obligation and encourage her to work out problems instead.

Some things to try

- Instead of saying: "The most important thing is that you're happy" say, "The most important thing is that you are kind."
- Make sure that your child always addresses others respectfully, even when they're tired, distracted, or angry.
- Emphasize caring when you interact with others including spouses, teachers, and store clerks.

Provide opportunities to practice

Children who have a habit of preforming acts of kindness and expressing gratitude are more likely to be helpful, generous, compassionate, and forgiving as well as happy and healthy. Learning to be caring is like learning to play a sport or an instrument. It requires daily repetition!

Some things to try...

- Don't reward your child for every act of helpfulness. Expect them to help around the house, with siblings, and with neighbors and only reward uncommon acts of kindness.
- Make gratitude a daily ritual at dinnertime, bedtime, in the car, etc.

Expand your child's circle of concern.

Almost all children care about a small circle of their families and friends. Our challenge is help them learn to care about those outside that circle such as the new kid in class or someone from a different culture.

Some things to try...

- Ensure your child is friendly and grateful to all the people in their lives such as a bus driver or the waitress.
- Encourage your child to care for those who are vulnerable like comforting a classmate who was teased.

• Use a newspaper or TV story to encourage your child to think about hardships faced by children in another country.

Be a strong example.

Children learn ethical values by watching the actions of adults they respect as well as processing through ethical dilemmas with adults, e.g. "Should I play with John at recess when my best friend doesn't like him?" As role models, we need to practice honesty, fairness, and caring ourselves. But we won't be perfect all the time. It is powerful to acknowledge our mistakes and flaws.



Some things to try...

• Model caring for others by performing acts of service to others in the community. Even better, include your child.

• Discuss ethical dilemmas during dinner or at bedtime. Listen to your child's perspective as you help him resolve situations he's faced in his day.

Vision Screenings

We will be conducting vision screenings for all Kindergartens & Grades 7th- 12th on February 28th, 2018 from 12:10pm to 2:00pm at the West Valley II Campus. The students will be given a distance vision test. We will notify you of the results of the test if your student fails. Likewise, if your student fails, you will receive a referral letter with more instructions.

Vision screening is not a substitute for an eye examination by an eye care specialist, and it is important that your child sees an eye care specialist once a year to evaluate eye health. If you do not wish your child to participate in the screening program, please pick up an exemption form at the Office.

We need a LOT of **parent volunteers** to assist with vision screenings. A short 15 minute training is provided, and this is a great way to get in your volunteer hours! This is not a volunteer opportunity that will work to bring small children.

Utah All-State High School Art Show - Izzy Baker



The Utah All-State High School Art Show was established 45 years ago to honor the best high school artists in the state for their talent, creativity, and dedication. The purpose of this exhibition is to foster original visual art among Utah teenagers by providing a professional forum for student artists. This exhibition is the result of an ongoing collaboration between the Springville Museum of Art, high school teachers, students, and various private partners. A panel of professional artists and arts administrators carefully studied each of the 989 entries from around the state to select the works of art featured in this exhibition. Comprising of 345 works from 98 high schools across Utah, this exhibition represents the promise of this young generation of artists.

Parents of AP Students

Second semester is here already. Our hard-working AP students are making great progress. AP teachers are working diligently to prepare them for college entrance and the big exams later this spring. The majority of AP students elect to purchase the year-end exam. The cost is **\$94** per exam, or **\$53** if your family participates in the federal Free/Reduced lunch program. For your convenience we've added the AP fees to Aspire profiles; if your student later decides not to test they can be removed. We also allow multiple small payment installments to help ease this process. We're accepting payments in the high school office now. You can even pay over the phone. All exams must be **paid in full before March 16, 2018**. Please do not allow high cost stop your student from engaging in the exam. If your family requires assistance, please have an adult contact Mr. Guido privately and options can be discussed. Although this exam is not required, APA does highly recommend it. Passing the test with a score of 3 or higher typically equates to college credit at their future university.
