Winterim Guide

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Introduction

American Preparatory Academy is thrilled for our annual Winterim program for the 2018-2019 school year. The Winterim term runs from *January 3rd through January 18th during normal school hours*. The day will be divided into three periods, with lunches built around the second period or block.

Students will have the opportunity to choose three courses from the Winterim catalog. These courses are designed to take students deeper into subject areas than they may cover during the normal scope of a course and to explore areas that are not covered in our daily curriculum. By the end of each 13-day course, students will have completed the equivalent of a semester's worth of curriculum and will often have a completed culminating project they can add to their resume or portfolio.

In addition to the skills and knowledge gained, 9th-12th grade students will receive .50 credits of elective credit towards their high school graduation.

Registration and Scheduling

Winterim schedules will be composed of three courses, an A course, a B course, and a C course. Students will have the opportunity to register for their classes beginning Monday, November 6th with priority given to 12th graders, then 11th graders, and so on until 7th graders register. Not all students will get their top picks, so make sure you read the catalog carefully and have up to 5 classes in mind as you register.

We encourage students to choose their Winterim courses carefully. It is very difficult to adjust schedules once registration has been finalized. If you need to change your Winterim classes there is a \$10 fine. The last day to change your course schedule is Friday, December 7th.

Final Winterim schedules will be processed and distributed to students during the week of December 17th-20th.

Courses with Fees

Some Winterim options have a cost associated with the course. These fees are kept as minimal as possible while still covering expenses like field trips, supplies, or other items necessary for the course. Without these fees, we would be unable to offer many of the exciting opportunities available during Winterim.

If you are scheduled for any Winterim courses with a fee, you must pay within a few days of registration to remain in that course. Any student who does not pay the required fee may be dropped from the course and required to schedule a different course.

Winterim Scheduling Priority

Due to the limited number of spaces in some Winterim courses, there will be some courses that have a higher demand than there are seats available. Priority will be given to seniors who will have the first registration day. The 11th graders will then be allowed to register next, then the 10th graders and so on until all grades have had the opportunity. Registration is done this way with the understanding that students in a lower grade have several additional years to pick Winterim courses and therefore have many chances to take the courses they want.

Math & Language Arts Boot Camps

Students who are not on level in math and/or latin may be placed in boot camp courses during Winterim to allow them to accelerate. Boot Camp will replace one or two elective classes during Winterim - students in Boot Camp classes will still attend one or two elective Winterim courses.

We will be making decisions about which students to place in these classes prior to the open enrollment dates. When students register for their Winterim classes the Math or Language Arts Boot Camps will already be in their schedule.

ARTS

Culinary Bread Making

Teacher: Mrs. Adams

Do you stay away from making bread because it looks too complicated, too time consuming? It is time to erase the stigma! We will learn a variety of breads, and how to turn single bread recipes into as array of dishes. Nothing is better than homemade bread. Smell the aroma of freshly baked bread in the kitchen.

Culinary Boot Camp

Course Description for Beginning Guitar:

□This course is designed for the beginning guitar student. The class is taught in a group setting with some individual responsibilities. No prior guitar experience is required. This class requires outside study and practice.

Upon completion of this course, the students will be able to:

- 1. Identify parts of the guitar
- 2. Tune guitar properly using relative tuning
- 3. Perform music using proper guitar technique (fingering, posture, hand position)
- 4. Perform guitar songs in a group setting as well as individually

The beginning guitar course is designed to teach the basics of acoustic guitar styles. Students will learn the basic chords, strums, and finger patterns by learning folk and popular songs.

The course is based on skill levels. Each skill level has a group of songs that the student must pass off. A grade of B or above is considered a pass. This does require singing along with the playing but vocal technique is not graded.

Each student must have a guitar that is available to them for class and outside practice. You will not be able to share a guitar with another student in the class, students are required to bring their own guitars and a capo to class every day. Students without a guitar will be transferred out of the class.

Each student is expected to participate in class activities with proper attitude for learning.

Collage Creation
