Boot Reminder

We want to remind all 7th-12th graders and their parents that boots are **not part of the uniform**. Students can wear boots on their way to school if they chose, but they must change into the uniform shoes once they are here in order to be in full uniform. This rule applies to the entire academic day including lunch and any Ambassador activities that require full uniform dress. Elementary students are allowed to wear plain brown or black boots with low heels during the months of October-March. Fresh Fruits & Veggies

The RAMBUTAN is a small hairy tropical fruit that is native to Indonesia. This piece of fruit is rather small. The skin can be described as hairy, but very soft with a leathery skin. The name rambutan comes from the Malay word rambut which means hairy. The fruit or flesh inside has a whitish, translucent look. It appears what a peeled grape can be envisioned as. The flesh has a very sweet, mild flavor. At times the flavor can resemble that of cotton candy. Inside the white flesh is a seed. The seed should NOT be eaten. The easiest way to eat the fruit is to simply put half of it in your mouth and lightly bite through, just breaking the leather skin. It will break fairly easily. With your mouth still biting down just simply pull the fruit away from your mouth and the skin will peel right off. If you bite around the white flesh you can pull the remaining piece of skin off. Eat the white flesh from around the seed. Discard the seed into the garbage. ENJOY!
