Hello American Prep Families,

Our Builder Theme for the month of October is "I Am A Builder When I Am Perfectly Honest."

Students need to develop a self-concept that includes "I am an honest person" and you can help by noticing when they are honest and saying those words — "I am so glad you strive to be an honest person". In order to get our students to this point, they need to CLEARLY understand what honesty means, and see it demonstrated. They also need to be CONVINCED of the vital importance of honesty in their life, in their relationships, and in our world. Often children learn about the importance of honesty when they fail to be honest and experience the discomfort, embarrassment, and repercussions. It is important to allow them to live the consequences of their actions so they will be motivated to make a different choice next time. Childhood is the time for these lessons to be learned, when the stakes are low and the learning potential is high. We hope you will take some time this month to discuss this in your families and find examples that your children can relate to and understand. Thank you for your support!
