Hello American Prep Families, <u>Our Builder Theme for the month of March is "I am a builder when I quickly</u> acknowledge my mistakes and humbly make amends."

When we read, we all go back over the word we mispronounced and say it correctly. When students are learning new information in class, there is a lot of repetition. Why is that? We have learned that if we go back and correct what we did wrong our brain will remember the last action, which is now a corrected one. Acknowledging our mistakes and correcting our behavior requires less time and energy than ignoring or wallowing in them. Clinical psychology research suggests that how people view mistakes dictate how well and how often people learn and progress. The quicker you acknowledge your mistake, and humbly make amends, shows that learning from mistakes improves and becomes easier with practice and repetition. Everyone makes mistakes. That doesn't mean you have failed it means you have found ONE way that didn't work.

6th Grade Parents

It's time for immunizations! In order to enter 7th grade all students must have the following:

- * Tdap booster
- * 2 doses of chickenpox (or a history of the disease)
- * 1 dose of Meningococcal

There are several other immunizations that are suggested, but not required. We are encouraging all students to get



the required immunizations and submit an updated record to the Elementary office before the end of the school year.

6th Grade Uniforms

As our 6th grade students are getting ready to transition to Junior High school we will implement the same policy for uniforms when 6th grade students return from spring break. Students will not be allowed in class unless their dress adheres to the dress code. Parents will be called to bring appropriate clothing or take the student home to get appropriate clothing if students appear at school out of uniform.
